The Pastor's Notes

EVENING BIBLE SCHOOL

This year's evening Bible School was timely and engaging. Rev. Christopher Edmonson encouraged us to think about stories in the Bible as often involving three parties: the protagonist, the other(s), and God. It is that third party, God, which transforms the story from simple narrative to theological imagination. We ask, "Where is God in the story of Joseph's brothers who hated Joseph?" "Where is God in how we interact with others who are hateful in our own lives?"

The example of Joseph and his brothers illustrates that the biblical stories are often those where the protagonist and the other(s) could easily dismiss each other or treat each other as enemies. With God as the third party, it becomes easier to see the sin of when neighbors become enemies and when enemies do not reconcile. It is easier to see the miracles when those who could so easily dismiss or hate treat each other as neighbors, friends or family. Joseph reconciles with his brothers who sold him into slavery, Gentile Ruth remains with Jewish Naomi, the Samaritan assists the Jew who is a stranger but is lying on the side of the road wounded from bandit attack...

We then consider the other(s) in our lives who could be treated in the moment as an enemy: a child in rebellion or a parent who can't surrender control, a spouse who is becoming a competitor instead of a partner, a neighbor who is too concerned (or not concerned enough) with boundaries, a friend who believes differently or votes differently, and those who

are strangers to us and who threaten us because of their differences. Chris suggested that keeping God in mind as the third party keeps us from so easily dismissing others or being so stubborn in defending our own biases and assumptions.

Chris suggested that Jesus sought out relationships that others would avoid. And what made Jesus' interactions so impactful was that he engaged the person even in opposition creating at least the possibility of discourse rather than discord.

Chris offered some practical guidance. How do you listen to other stories? He offered some tips. He offered tips too on crafting your own story with God as the third party so that the story you tell becomes "testimony," or "theological memoir." He provided a bibliography of memoirs by authors of different races and genders with perspectives both conservative and progressive, old and young. Listing them together reinforces the idea that because these wildly different people have the common ground of that third party in their lives--the biblical God of Jesus Christ, the God of justice and compassion--the church truly is to be one of discourse, not discord.

Thank you, Chris.

I did not attend the corresponding Bible/Theater camp for children, but I had spies. Chris' children, Gabe and Amelia, helped with the camp and they gave me a report of each evening. I also saw evidence of their time together through the performance offered on Wednesday evening. Thank you, Meg Griffith and Emma Sala, for leading this time with children.

And thank you, Jennifer Powell, for doing such a great job hosting the entire Bible School.

SUMMER SERMON SERIES

On the last night of Bible School, Chris Edmonson, without knowing it, promoted a summer sermon series we planned. He said that we become more aware of God's story in the telling and living of our stories when we integrate into our lives rhythms that remind us who we are as God's children. This is true for us as individuals. It is also true for us as a diverse community of faith which, despite differences, finds reasons to worship, love, serve, and learn within the shared desire to know and follow Jesus.

We pastors are pleased to announce a summer sermon series that will begin mid-July. The series is titled, "Habits of the Heart." Each week, we will focus upon a spiritual rhythm that guides us toward lives that reflect the reconciliation, compassion, and justice of God.

In conjunction with each sermon, a survey will be conducted that addresses areas of church life that reflect the four spiritual rhythms. In addition to giving you an opportunity to provide helpful feedback on ministries of the church, the surveys will make clear that in speaking of the habit of worship, the practice of love, the practice of compassion, and the willingness to learn, we are not merely speaking of concepts. There are real, concrete ways through which we can participate in these spiritual rhythms together and apart.




