committee meetings. Video projection can be helpful in worship, and we don't even need screens! Making payments and giving is so much easier. The weekly Pastor's Email, the church's YouTube channel and Facebook page are not going anywhere.

Without guaranteeing anything, here are other things I'm anticipating in terms of congregational life.

- In worship, we'll return to passing plates during communion.
- Attendance at Sunday School and worship will increase even as we offer the capacity to attend online.
- We'll offer video devotions during Lent (building on the success of last year's series).
- The Mountain Ave. Fund will grow to the point where it can finally, and permanently make ongoing grants to local ministries dealing with poverty and children's concerns.
- We'll track the renovation and construction of four *Mission Build* projects as we anticipate four Dedication celebrations.
- We'll continue to address social issues as well as how we can better have more productive dialogue about them.
- Past opportunities will be offered again: Christmas pageant, church retreat, men's retreat, and specialized studies.
- We will get to know some of the remarkable people who have joined our church.
- When some of you who have participated remotely feel comfortable coming back to church, you will be able to better watch the children grow up.
- And, we will once again host the Kittye Susan Trent Symposium for Newly Ordained Ministers. My next note will tell you more.

#### TRENT SYMPOSIUM 2022

After a two-year layoff due to the pandemic, our church will finally host another *Kittye Susan Trent Symposium for Newly Ordained Ministers*. The event, co-sponsored by our congregation and Union Presbyterian Seminary, will take place May 6-11, 2022.

For those new to the church, the symposium is a special and unique gift to the larger church. Through an invitation/application process, eight newly ordained PC(USA) ministers from around the nation are invited to come to Roanoke for six days of seminars that focus primarily on practical areas of ministry. The seminars are led by a seminary professor, experienced ministers and laypeople who have expertise in areas not covered well in seminary (finances, personnel, conflict, creative writing).

During the symposium, there will be opportunities for the congregation to meet the visiting ministers. You'll hear more about those opportunities later. However, we want to announce to the congregation who was selected for the program in case you have a connection with one of them or the churches they serve.




John and Sue are so happy to have found a church home at Second Pres. and are looking forward to serving here. We are happy for that, too.

The pandemic has forced us to stretch and grow in new ways. One of the lessons we learned as a pastoral team is that worship can take shape via various media. In 2021, we held radio parking lot Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday services, we pre-recorded and live streamed opportunities for education and worship regularly, and we grew more familiar with the ways technology could help us reach a community beyond our physical walls. Embracing our newfound technology and flexibility, we will offer a blended format for Kairos worship this Lent. We will hold Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday services in person at the church, and midweek video reflections via our church YouTube channel and Facebook page in the weeks between.


# POP-UP SUNDAY SCHOOL: JANUARY 23, Fellowship Hall

#### WHITE TOO LONG

This fall, your pastors undertook a study of Robert P. Jones' new 2021 book White Too Long. Jones is the CEO and founder of Public Religion Research Institute (PRRI), a religious scholar and commentator, and holds a PhD from Emory University and MDiv from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary.



White Too Long is a timely and appropriate book for the American church as our nation grapples with the legacy of racism. With his family Bible in one hand and public surveys in the other, Jones plumbs the depths of American religious history and the church's complicity in the sins of slavery, Reconstruction, the Lost Cause, and the aftermath. He explores the sermons, prayers, and letters of key religious leaders and institutions, unveiling the origins and support of much of American religious thought.

It is a painful and difficult read. Having been raised and educated in the Southern Protestant church, we found it hard to confront some of its history. As hard as some information is to learn, we all agree it is an important and helpful book. We are grateful for the experience of reading and discussing it. White Too Long helps us better recognize the corporate sins we share. In being honest about who we have been and how we have fallen short, we approach the Living God who forgives, corrects, and calls us to live a better way. May we grow in wisdom and understanding with such truth laid bare and may we hold onto humility as we strive to live a religious life more worthy.

The Open Door Sunday School Class plans to explore this new book this winter. Whether you plan to attend their class discussion in person or online, or are interested in learning more about church history on your own, we commend the book to your reading.
