TRUSTEES

Church Trustees serve a legal function within the church as well as oversee funds entrusted to their care. The Trustees of Second Presbyterian Church are a unique group for two reasons. First, there is no term limit and, second, only three serve in this capacity at one time. Those who are nominated to serve as trustees are longtime members of both the congregation and College of Elders. Over many years of service, they have gained the respect of the session and congregation for having demonstrated wise and faithful leadership.

Bill Lemon has served as a trustee since 2004. He was elected to the position because of his faithful participation in the life and worship of the church and because of his leadership in many important areas which include his service as an elder and as a Second Fund director. Bill served with distinction as a trustee not only in fulfilling his assigned responsibilities but also in showing a personal interest in those who received scholarship assistance from the Trustee Funds that support seminary education.

Bill considers it an honor to have served as a trustee of the church. Having been a trustee for so many years, he chose to resign to allow someone else to be honored in the same way. His resignation was effective the end of December 31, 2021. At a recent congregational meeting, Ron Ayers was chosen to fill his spot.



OPEN MIND

I have found a clear, interactive, often entertaining and easy-to-grasp guide to why conversations can be difficult and how we can better have them. Former city manager, Chris Morrell, introduced me to the site, openmindplatform.org which guides participants through eight 30-minute exercises that help them understand why conversations can be so difficult with those who disagree. With other Roanoke leaders, I've attended a workshop led by someone representing the "Open Mind" organization that produced it.

I am excited about this resource for two reasons. First, it offers in a highly accessible way the insights of one of the wisest books I've read in years, Jonathan Haidt's *The Righteous Mind: Why Good People are Divided on Politics and Religion*. Second, it addresses the "issue behind the issues." Conversation and debate about issues such as racism, immigration, voting rights, pandemic restrictions, gun violence, policing, health care, and climate change are often unproductive because they are conducted in ways that are polarizing and harmful. "If we disagree, we should talk," some say. "Yes, but not if talking about it only makes things worse." Family members quit speaking and friends become ex-friends when some conversations get out of hand.

So, do you want to better understand why conversations with certain family members, friends, neighbors and co-workers go south so easily? Do you want to develop skills in order to be more effective when in those conversations? Are you open to better recognizing your own irrationalities and what you might need to understand in what you find difficult to hear? Would you be willing to do so in person with me and not by Zoom? And would you be willing to commit to going through the 30-minute interactive session prior to each meeting to discuss?




SUSTAINABILITY TIP OF THE MONTH

As of January 1, 2022 the City of Roanoke, in an effort to curb the use of plastic bags, has begun charging a 5-cent fee for each plastic bag used at grocery stores, drugstores, convenience stores, and larger retailers.

KAIROS LENT 2022

When the pandemic began (nearly two years ago!) I thought we all might be able to use that time as a “reset” button. I had hoped we would consider it an opportunity to reevaluate how and where our energy is spent. But we seem to have hit a new “normal,” without too many substantive changes for how our time is used. It’s incredible how incredibly busy so many of us remain. The days still fly by, and weeks or months can pass in what feels like a moment.

The cyclical rhythm of the church year can be a welcome reminder of the passage of time and God’s hand in it. Lent, like Advent, is a time of waiting and preparation. Only, unlike Advent, we’re waiting not for Jesus’ arrival but for his death and resurrection. Generally, the season is a time of reflection and introspection as we evaluate our lives in the light of who Christ is and what he has called us to be. Many years ago, we named a Lenten practice of evening worship “Kairos.” This ancient Greek word describes finding “the right or opportune moment.” *Kairos* (καῖρός), has been used over the centuries to describe time for spiritual reflection, and even, to put it simply, “God’s time.”

This spring, the church is offering a “blended” experience for Kairos Lenten worship. We will hold both a few in person opportunities for spiritual practice and worship, and offer a number of virtual reflections online. God’s time, really, can be anytime. We pray that this Lenten practice may be welcome time of quiet, reflection, and connection to the Holy in the midst of this changing season.


MEN’S BIBLE STUDY
