2022 LIL BROWN GRANT AWARDS

Through the generosity of church member, Lillian S. Brown, our church awards grants from the Lil Brown Benevolence Fund each year. Prior to her death, Lil designated the Second Presbyterian Church Fund, Inc. as the beneficiary of her retirement account. She requested the funds be used to establish a benevolence fund with a focus on supporting those dealing with mental health and poverty. Thus, in 2009, the Lil Brown Benevolence Fund was established and has been funding grant awards to support mental health issues in our community—especially when they intersect with poverty.

Each year, the Service and Outreach committee reviews grant applications for the Lil Brown Benevolence Fund considering the purpose of the grant in relation to Lil’s wishes. Grant applications must outline a specific grant purpose, have a clear impact on mental illness in our community and include budget information. Grants are awarded for one year and generally range between \$1,000-\$7,000. After careful review and discussion, the Service and Outreach Committee recommends grant awards that then must be approved by Session and the Second Fund prior to disbursement. Listed below are the 2022 Lil Brown Benevolence Fund recipients.

Bradley Free Clinic to support the purchase of needed mental health medications to be used in behavioral health management. Bradley Free Clinic’s mission is to provide compassionate and comprehensive health care services for underserved residents of the Roanoke Valley and surrounding area.

Highland Park Elementary School to support the Imagine Me Mentoring program. The Imagine Me program works with at risk youth to create positive long-standing relationships, help build social skills and assist in students’ academic journey.

Family Service of Roanoke Valley to train two therapists in Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing Therapy (EMDR). EMDR therapy has proven effective in treating those suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder, medical issues, anxiety and depression.

Total Action for Progress (TAP) for Super Hero Kids to fund the operation of Super Hero Kids. Super Hero Kids is a program for survivors of domestic violence ages 5-17. Their curriculum incorporates nationally recognized trauma informed therapeutics and coping techniques.

The church is thankful for Lil’s forethought, compassion and generosity in remembering those in need and taking steps to help. Those who knew Lil are not surprised by her gift. The Service and Outreach Committee, Session and the Second Fund remain diligent and thoughtful in determining grant recipients hoping to be good stewards of the fund and always remembering Lil’s desires in supporting those suffering in our community.

Easter Worship



For Adults: We look forward to the return of our annual Evening VBS! Launching our Evening VBS theme at Picnic Sunday worship this year, the Rev. Howard Dudley will be our guest speaker. Many of you may remember Howard as our guest speaker at the Trent Getaway in 2019. Howard has served as the pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Dunne, NC since the summer of 2016. He is an ordained teaching elder in the Presbyterian Church (USA), and a graduate of East Carolina University and Union Presbyterian Seminary.



Howard has served as a music leader and speaker at churches, youth conferences, and retreats throughout the country, including the Montreat Youth Conference and Massanetta Middle School Conference. He is married to Meg Lindsay Dudley, who serves as the Pastor of Bluff Presbyterian Church in Wade, NC. They have two daughters, Lindsay and Julia.

Theme “The Case for Going to Church”: There are so many things one could do on Sunday Morning. You could go jogging. You could take a yoga class. You could mow your grass. You could enjoy eggs Benedict and mimosas over brunch. Instead, we Christians are expected to drag ourselves out of bed, get dressed, and go to church, where we'll sit in uncomfortable pews, sing songs full of old words no one understands, and hear stories

about a peasant carpentry worker who lived thousands of years ago in a land thousands of miles away from us. Why would anyone think this is something worth doing? In a world as busy as ours, any commitment you make requires a clear purpose. You go to school to learn. You go to work to earn a living. You go to the gym to get fit. You go to the dentist to get your teeth cleaned. But why should you go to church? What difference is it supposed to make in your life?

For Children: A children's theater program led by Meg Griffith will also be available, free of charge, thanks to a gift from the Trent Fund. Registration for the children's program will begin this spring (childcare will also be available in our church nursery upon request.). Meg is an actor, teacher, director, and choreographer with over 15 years of professional theatre experience. Meg has taught workshops at a variety of schools, camps, theaters, churches and conferences all over the country and locally at Roanoke College and Roanoke Children's Theatre.
