It also was exciting to know that the collected monies would go to support agencies and ministries in the presbytery which deal with hunger concerns.

The tradition was suspended during the pandemic, but happily will be resumed the last Sunday of May. If you would like to participate, you can literally deposit pennies in a jar during meals or do the math come Sunday, May 29.



SUSTAINABILITY PLAN CELEBRATES **ONE YEAR ANNIVERSARY**

- This month marks the one year anniversary of the Session approving the church Sustainability Plan. The plan is available for review at https://www.spres.org/about/ policies/. The plan responds to the General Assembly of the PC(USA)'s 1990 adoption of Restoring Creation for Ecology and Justice as well as a follow up 2006 Resolution calling on all Presbyterians "to make a bold Christian witness by aspiring to live carbon neutral lives."
- It identifies sustainable practices for greening the church's facilities, grounds, operations, and maintenance; and calls on our clergy, staff, and congregation to integrate environmental stewardship and climate justice throughout the life of the church. Guidance for the plan is modeled on Earth Care Congregations: A Guide to Greening Presbyterian Churches and ENER-GY STAR® Action Workbook for Congregations.

To help facilitate implementation of the plan, the **2PC** Green Team was established in January 2022 and has been working on the following initiatives:

- Calculating the church's annual carbon emissions

- - 2PC Green Team... "Grounded in Scripture, Informed by Science."



CURRENT LEGACY OPPORTUNITIES SECOND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

You probably know that our church has many funds, but you may not be aware of how they are used or their original purpose. Our funds greatly enrich our programs and our operations, strengthen our ministry locally and internationally, and ensure future resources for excelling in ministry not just to the next generation, but to all of the ones who follow. Our past donors had wonderful intentions, and Second Presbyterian honors their memory by continuing to fund the programs that they intended when they so graciously gave these gifts.

Education

- Edmunds Fund brings persons of national or international reputation to challenge and inspire us with Biblical messages in preaching or in teaching.
- **Preschool Fund** for Second's Preschool program.
- Trent Fund for educational programs and scholarships.
- **Trustees: Johnson Fund** provides in whole or in part for the college or postgraduate education of a student preparing for ministerial or other religious works.
- **Trustees:** Payne Fund for general scholarships for members of Second Presbyterian to Union Presbyterian Seminary and for the charitable purpose of the Presbyterian Homes.
- William R. Klein Fund provides greater opportunities for continuing education and covers the cost of educational experiences and sabbaticals for our professional preaching staff.

Facilities and Operation Expenses

- **Columbarium Fund** for long-term care and maintenance of the Columbarium.
- **Property Maintenance and Repair Fund** allows the execution of roof repair, HVAC repair, plumbing and electrical projects.

Long-term Viability

• **Second Fund** – for the use of the church as it engages in promoting or carrying out religious, charitable, benevolent or literary purposes.

Mission and Outreach

INAUGURAL MOUNTAIN AVE FUND DISBURSEMENTS

In late 2018, an anonymous couple within our church established the Mountain Avenue Fund with the objective of supporting local agencies dealing with issues of hunger, homelessness, poverty, and at-risk children. The couple committed to making donations to the fund for five years at which point distributions would be made from the fund. Happily, due to additional contributions made by members of our congregation and community, in December 2021 the fund reached the threshold in which distributions could be made earlier than expected. What joyous news!

Each year, the church will disburse money from the Mountain Avenue Fund to local agencies that support the fund causes. The Presbyterian Community Center and the Rescue Mission are permanent beneficiaries of the fund with the Session selecting additional recipients who feed the hungry, support at-risk children and other fund causes.
