## ABOUT THE MISSION BUILD CAMPAIGN

**SECOND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH** has a long history of seeking to find direction by following in the footsteps of Jesus, loving our neighbors as ourselves, and caring for those in need. Together, we have supported organizations and programs on local, national, and international horizons that work to make the world more loving and compassionate, while building the Kingdom of God.

In 2019, four of the church’s long-term mission partners—all healthy, thriving, and on the verge of major transition into new chapters of ministry—came to the church *at the same time* requesting help with projects that were absolutely critical to their ministries. They were:

The renovation of the Alpha Omega House, our own mission center across the street from the church, which is to be renamed the Alexa House. The building was in serious disrepair and in need of renovating to better serve families experiencing homelessness in our area, and to serve other local mission-centered organizations, as well.

The Presbyterian Community Center, a local church mission partner since its founding, requested help in the process of raising funds to construct a new facility to better serve families and children in need in Southeast Roanoke. The current facility is inadequate, and the needs are great.

Union Presbyterian Seminary, knowing of our commitment to nurture future leadership of the church, asked if we would help establish a leadership institute and center that would be named in honor of Dr. William R. Klein, a Seminary alumnus who served as Senior Pastor of Second Presbyterian for nearly 30 years.

Solid Rock International, our mission partner of almost two decades, requested help in replacing the clinic we support in the Dominican Republic. An up-to-date hospital will replace the clinic, which sat in a flood plain. During this partnership, our church has sent 28 mission teams, over 800 individuals and countless supplies to serve in the areas of construction, Bible school, surgery and general medical care.

After much prayer and careful discernment, the church felt called to support all four projects. So, we decided to do something quite bold and challenging: conduct a capital campaign that would be purely for missions. A campaign committee was formed, and the campaign was named the Mission Build Campaign. The goal became \$1.7 million dollars, and the campaign launched on Sunday, January 26, 2020. Almost as soon as the campaign began, the COVID-19 pandemic swept the globe. The campaign went on a pause, but after a year we realized the pandemic was ongoing and the needs were growing. The campaign was restarted, and funds were raised primarily through phone calls. This church and community responded with exceeding generosity. On March 7, 2022, we crossed the \$1.7 million goal.

The Mission Build Campaign was a call to Second Presbyterian Church to spread God’s love here at home and much farther away. Renovations are planned and construction will occur, but more than that, the larger church will be served and families will be served—families experiencing hard times and homelessness, families in need of food or shelter, families seeking medical attention, families needing expressions of God’s love.

We are so grateful for your generous and heartfelt response to that call. This is truly an extraordinary witness the church has made. The impact of your generosity will be felt across the globe throughout our lifetimes and beyond.

## ALPHA OMEGA HOUSE RENOVATION & RENAMING



### AO House Renovation to Serve Local Ministries

The Alpha Omega House, Second Presbyterian’s mission center across the street from the church, provides space for local ministries such as Family Promise of Greater Roanoke and Assisting Families of Inmates (AFOI).

Family Promise of Greater Roanoke provides transitional housing, services, job assistance and more, with the specific goal to keep local families out of homelessness. Family Promise allows our congregation to provide a meaningful and loving response to a huge community need: *We provide financial support for the organization, prayerful support of the families,*

*and a home for the families 5-6 weeks a year in our Alpha Omega House.* When the families are on site, we (with our Beth Israel neighbors) prepare and serve dinner, spend the night, and are a constant presence in the home. The house is in a state of disrepair with no working shower, rooms that do not have working windows, and only two bathrooms to support a capacity of four families. There is a great need for additional congregations across Roanoke to use our space when it is upgraded to serve families in the program. The space becomes a home for these children and their parents, giving them a place of warmth and stability during an otherwise difficult time.

Beloved church member Alexa Cannon will be remembered and honored in a special way. Thanks to a significant lead gift from Bill and Shireen Kirk, Alexa’s uncle and aunt, given in support of the session’s desire to rename the Alpha Omega House in Alexa’s memory, the house will be known as Alexa House. Alexa’s kind, creative, and giving spirit will be honored with this living memorial. The house that will bear her name will provide hospitality to families in crisis and be a place of healing and hope for many years to come.

## PRESBYTERIAN COMMUNITY CENTER EXPANSION & NEW FACILITY

### Presbyterian Community Center

Second Presbyterian Church has partnered with the Presbyterian Community Center (PCC) since its founding over five decades ago. The PCC has grown beyond meeting crisis needs and added programs that address life conditions that keep people in the cycle of poverty. A powerful example is the Pathways for Youth after-school program that offers mentoring, tutoring and counseling that keep children in school and then into college. Healthcare, workplace training, and daycare are goals for expansion. However, the PCC must make a major shift from present facilities, both because they are tapped out in terms of space and because of high maintenance.

The new facility will provide many opportunities to expand, including increasing enrollment in the Pathways for Youth program to 80 children annually as well as accommodating young children in grades K-2, and creating community spaces for meetings, events, and family nights.

## WILLIAM R. KLEIN CENTER AT WESTMINSTER HALL RENOVATION

### Leadership Institute and Klein Center

Westminster Hall, an historic structure built in 1897 and one of Union Presbyterian Seminary’s three original buildings, will be renovated to house the new Leadership Institute and William R. Klein Center. Westminster is listed on the National Register of Historic Places but has sat vacant for years. The campaign funds will help relocate the Leadership Institute and will provide a technologically advanced environment for continuing education opportunities. The Klein Center, located on the first floor, will include a large seminar room with a capacity of 75 and a small conference room with a capacity of 12, breakout rooms, and offices. It will integrate digital media, webinars, podcasts, and other interactive tools to broaden engagement within new and current continuing education opportunities.

### Naming and Acknowledgment

In naming the Center for Dr. William R. Klein, Union Presbyterian Seminary wishes to honor Dr. Klein’s lifelong dedication to the church and his service to the people of the Roanoke Valley. Many generations at Second Presbyterian have been touched by his ministry. Union Presbyterian Seminary would also like to honor Dr. Klein for his work at the Seminary after his graduation in 1954: for his service as a Seminary trustee and campaign chair, and for his teaching-mentoring of numerous Seminary students at the Didactic Seminar on Reformed Theology.

## NON-PROFIT CLINIC TO SERVE A REGION IN NEED

Solid Rock International is in the process of constructing a non-profit clinic that will fulfill the original vision of serving the poorest of the poor while providing opportunities to expand available services to the southwestern region of the Dominican Republic. The new clinic will bring access to medical care to many Dominicans living in poverty and unable to travel. It is estimated that the clinic will open and begin serving patients by the end of 2022.



### The REVOLUTION Clinic will offer:

- 46,242 square feet of clinic space
- 56 beds
- Increase in annual surgical procedures from 600 to 1,000
- Increase in annual patient services provided from 38,000 to 86,000
- New services for the community including: Ambulance Services, Blood Bank, Emergency Care, Endocrinology, Gastroenterology, Neonatal Intensive Care, Ophthalmology, Orthodontics, Orthopedics, Physical Therapy, Radiology, and Urology
