EDMUNDS LECTURES

I am happy to say that after a two year delay, we are having another Edmunds Lecture series. We are bringing back the series in style. Our speaker will be one of the top New Testament scholars in the world today, Dr. Ben Witherington III. I am grateful to Carol Widmeyer for being my "in with Ben." Her family is so close to Ben's that for years they vacationed together. When I learned that, I dropped Carol's name in inviting Ben (this isn't my first Lecture rodeo).

Over two evenings, November 6 and 7 at 7:00 p.m., Ben will help us go deeper into our understanding of the Gospels and what it means to be a follower of Jesus. He will bring not only the benefits of his lifelong study of the Gospels but also his proven ability to find connections to our lives and hearts.

Ben will offer the kind of lectures that will honor the intent of Buddy Edmunds, who gave the seed money to establish it. Buddy established the series in honor of his father, Dr. Spencer Edmunds, who served our church as senior minister. Buddy understood that laypeople are capable of thinking deeply about their faith. That so many Edmunds Lectures have been a success has justified his confidence that scholars and ministers are not the only ones who can benefit from hearing what good theological minds have to say.

Following each lecture, there will be a reception where you will have an opportunity to speak with Ben and each other.

SUSTAINABILITY SPOTLIGHT

Last month, several members of the 2PC Green Team attended the first ever Presbytery of the Peaks Earth Care Summit. Congregations from Blacksburg, Lynchburg, Martinsville, and Roanoke participated via Zoom while also meeting locally. The purpose of the summit was to encourage churches to recognize their unique position to address the nurture and care of the earth; and to take steps to promote and grow Earth Care in their congregations.

"As a faith community, we can be a model to the larger community and a witness to the faith we profess by taking visible concrete actions that express what we believe about creation and our role in caring for it." – Presbytery of the Peaks Earth Care Workshop

Dr. Katharine Hayhoe was the keynote video speaker. She is an author and atmospheric scientist who studies climate change and is also a professor of Political Science at Texas Tech University. In 2021 she joined the Nature Conservancy as Chief Scientist. She is an evangelical Christian and the daughter of missionaries. Her latest book is *Saving Us: A Climate Scientist's Case for Hope and Healing in a Divided World*.

"For Christians, doing something about climate change is about living out our faith... caring for those who need help and taking responsibility for this planet that God created and entrusted to us. My faith tells me that God does want people to understand climate change and do something about it."

One of the big take aways from the summit was encouraging churches to become certified Earth Care Congregations modeled on the PCUSA's **Earth Care Congregations: A Guide to Greening Presbyterian Churches**. This is one of the Green Team's primary goals as it identifies opportunities to include Earth Care and sustainability in the life of our congregation.

The following statement by PCUSA on Earth Care was made more than 30 years ago and reaffirmed in 2010. We hope to join with and follow in the footsteps of our sister churches in the Presbytery of the Peaks who have made Earth Care a central focus of their congregational life.

"We recognize and accept that restoring creation is a central concern of the church, to be incorporated into its life and mission at every level, with major implications for infusion into theological work, evangelism, education, justice and peacemaking, worship and liturgy, public witness, global mission and congregational service, and action at the community level."

SERVICE & OUTREACH CHRISTMAS SUPPORT FOR KIDS AND SENIORS

The Service and Outreach Committee is providing two ways to provide some cheer to those in need this Christmas season:

"Be a Santa to a Senior" Angel Tree

While one often thinks of children going without gifts at Christmas, the hard reality is that many seniors spend this time of year alone and unremembered. Second Presbyterian is sponsoring a "Be a Santa to a Senior" Angel Tree this year. Stop by church beginning November 13 to select a tag from the Angel Tree, shop for your senior, then return your gift by Sunday, December 4.

West End Center Coat Collection

Second Presbyterian has supported the Beth-El Farmworker Ministry in Wimauma, Florida for 15 years. They are focused on helping migrant farmworkers by offering opportunities for hunger relief, education, healthcare, and spiritual growth. We recently received the following update from Beth-El's executive director, Teresita Matos-Post:

"Your gifts ... have enabled us to maintain the efficient operations of our food pantry serving 450-600 households each week. We have been able to enhance safety features for our drive-through distribution such as balusters to avoid cars impacting the structure and signage to protect the safety of our volunteers. During this recession, together we have helped to keep 257 families safe in their homes through our financial assistance program by providing aid to pay their rent, mortgages, and utilities. That means that an average of 1,028 individuals were able to remain in their homes by avoiding eviction and have provided safe and healthy homes by keeping running water and electricity. Last year our team participated in a Mental Health First Response training, increasing their capacity to effectively respond to the increasing challenges and stress families are facing. Earlier this year, all our team members completed training to build awareness and prevention of Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC). This training will help us identify potential victims of human trafficking and tools on how to respond appropriately.

[Going forward], we are honing in our efforts to go deeply into the work of ending poverty by creating a sense of belonging. During the summer months many of our families migrate to other states seeking work, but many others choose to stay locally for the sake of the children. They take different types of jobs, but daycare centers that serve farmworkers close during summer months. Next year we are planning to offer full day/week-long summer camp, that would include elements of Vacation Bible School and also programming to teach about food, food sources, gardening, nutrition, and cooking. We would provide children and youth opportunities to feed mind, body, and spirit, while also building community by sharing their gifts, leadership, and knowledge."



LOCAL OFFICE ON AGING (LOA)

The November Outreach Offering will support the Local Office on Aging's (LOA) meal programs: Meals on Wheels and Diner's Club. The Meals on Wheels program provides a hot, nutritious lunch to homebound elderly who have no one to provide lunch for them. Diner's Club meets monthly to provide a meal, program, and fellowship to seniors in communities who need socialization and nutrition. LOA provides the resources necessary to help our aging population remain in their home and live independently for as long as possible. LOA administers more than 30 community services providing nutrition, education, advocacy, and socialization to:

- Enhance quality of life in the home,
- Encourage aging in place to avoid early institutionalization,
- Provide caregiver support,
- Advocate for quality services, medical care, and housing for the elderly.

Additionally, another opportunity is available to support needy seniors during this Christmas season. While one often thinks of children going without gifts at Christmas, the hard reality is that many seniors spend this time of year alone and unremembered. LOA's Christmas gift program, **BE A SANTA TO A SENIOR**, provides gifts to 190 elderly whose Christmas wishes hang on LOA's ANGEL TREE.

Second Presbyterian is pleased to sponsor an LOA ANGEL TREE for this season! On November 13, approximately 75 Angel Tree Tags will be available on our tree located in Kirk Hall. Angel Tree gifts need to be returned to the church by Sunday, December 4.

FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR: CHARITABLE IRA DISTRIBUTIONS—A GREAT OPPORTUNITY FOR BOTH THE CHURCH AND THE DONOR

If you are 72 you are probably working on your RMD. That is the required minimum distribution from your IRA annually. Hopefully you are aware that there is a way to satisfy the RMD, yet do it in such a way that the distribution is no longer taxable. It is called the Qualifying Charitable Distribution (QCD). Some simple rules: 1: You must be 72. 2: It must be paid from a traditional IRA or Roth IRA. 3: Must be paid DIRECTLY from the IRA custodian to the charity. 4: Paid to a qualifying charity (Second Presbyterian qualifies). If you meet all of the requirements listed above, the annual limit for QCDs is \$100,000 per IRA account owner. Every situation is different, so you should always talk with your tax advisor first to see if this strategy makes sense to your unique situation. But wouldn't it be great if the use of QCD helps both you and the church?


