of this writing is that we have a promising start... if pledges continue to come in and we continue to have broad-based support.

I hope that both the membership and the community now know of Second Presbyterian Church's serious commitment to outreach. What the church was able to do these past two years in response to the needs of those most affected by the pandemic and in response to the needs of critical mission partners, is an important story we should continue to tell. Let it not be said that this congregation retreated from its responsibilities when we were forced apart. Continuing to support missions is one reason that all supporters who are able should pledge.

With commitment to missions being a given, I hope that another reason for broad-based support can be rightly heard. As a congregation, we are unusually blessed with an outstanding staff. Being well-webbed in the larger church, I know of a lot of church staffs, and ours is the best I know of. Whether by effective searches, good luck, or God's blessings, we have outstanding people in place who offer excellent support of programs, worship, music, missions, education, children and youth programs, and congregational care. Look at how well live stream worship is conducted, how effective we communicate with membership, how well the facilities are cared for, how good the fellowship programs are for all ages, and how meaningful are the classes and worship services.

Inflation is a real factor last year and this. The best way to help retain excellent staff during inflation, without putting an undue burden on supporters who themselves must deal with inflation's impact, is not for a few people to give more than they should but for more people to give what they can.

So, if you've pledged, on behalf of those served by our church's outreach, and on behalf of those served by the staff, thank you. If you have not yet pledged, I thank you in advance for doing so.

SUSTAINABILITY SPOTLIGHT ENERGY AUDIT PART 2

"You can't manage what you can't measure."

Following up on October's Sustainability Spotlight, the Energy Audit Report of the Main Church Building was presented to the Property Committee by the building sciences consultant. The Property Committee is currently reviewing the report and will be returning comments to the consultant for incorporation into the Final Report. The Intersection and Alexa's House were not included in the audit.

As a reminder, the audit is a first step in identifying ways for our Main Church Building to use less energy and improve energy efficiency—ways that result in saving the church money and lowering CO₂ emissions.

The quote, "You can't manage what you can't measure" is often attributed to Peter Drucker, the Austrian-born American management consultant, educator, and author. In this case it is being applied to the Main Church Building's use of electricity. The data below is based on the electric utility bills and documents the Main Church Building's 1) electricity use, 2) carbon emissions, and 3) energy cost for 2019-2021.


1: A kWh equals the amount of energy used by a 1,000 watt appliance (such as a microwave oven) running for one hour.

- 2: Examples of one ton of CO₂ church equivalents:
 - Amount of electricity used by the church every 1.3 days
 - One month of church waste going to the regional landfill

As the church implements policies and practices to reduce and conserve energy, the annual energy cost and CO_2 emissions should begin to decline. The data will be checked annually to verify this is the case. The data will also be used to help identify areas where improvement is needed. A copy of the final Energy Audit Report will be posted on the church's website in early 2023.
