

### **BULLETIN NOTES**

<sup>1</sup> God Be the Love to Search and Keep Me was written by Richard Bruxvoort Colligan in 1967 while working on a theology and arts degree at United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities. The text is meant to evoke the beautiful Breastplate Prayer of St. Patrick. Bruxvoort was "attracted to the imagery and inherent mysticism in the language and appreciated the earth-based Celtic sensibilities in the poetry." Though originally written in the first-person singular, Bruxvoort uses the first person plural to symbolize different voices coming together to sing the prayer together (Source: Glory to God: A Companion).

<sup>2</sup>The Outreach Offering for the month of March will support *Child Health Investment Partnership (CHIP)*. Gun violence in Roanoke has increased at alarming rates. Working directly with the Roanoke police and the Gun Violence Intervention committee, CHIP will implement a comprehensive program in March aimed at both reducing gun violence and providing badly needed therapeutic counseling to individuals and families. Money raised through Second's Outreach Offering will help cover CHIP's cost of providing personal gun safety education in the homes of families living in the most crime-ridden neighborhoods in the city, where one in every three families have been directly impacted by gun violence. CHIP will meet families in their homes to provide gun safety education, gun locks, and professional counseling to nearly 400 families who already know and trust CHIP's outreach team. Second's March Outreach Offering can help turn the tide against gun violence in our city.

The February Outreach Offering supported the *West End Center*. In total, \$3,544.90 was collected.
