¹ THE PRAYER OF CONFESSION was adapted from a prayer on the website: The Pastor's Workshop.

²Westminster Confession of Faith: The Westminster Assembly was called together by the English Parliament in 1643 during the English Civil War. Meetings happened in Westminster Abbey until 1649. The Westminster Confession was completed in 1646 and approved by parliament in June of 1648. In 1660, when the English monarch was restored, the episcopal form of government was reinstated, and the Presbyterian confession lost its official status in England. The Church of Scotland adopted the confession in 1647. So, one of the most influential confessions of faith for Presbyterians came to be in a brief window of Presbyterianism in England.

³The Outreach Offering for the month of April will support the *Fralin Free Clinic's Medical Street Outreach Program of the Rescue Mission*. The Medical Street Outreach program represents a vital component of its holistic approach to serving the needs of the unsheltered and underserved populations within the Roanoke community. This service brings essential medical care directly to the streets, offering immediate health services to those who might otherwise go without due to barriers such as lack of transportation, mental health struggles, or unawareness of available resources. Staffed by dedicated healthcare professionals and volunteers, the outreach program provides screenings, basic treatment, referrals to specialized care, and health education, all free of charge. Your April outreach offering will go directly toward the \$9,500 cost of restoring and retrofitting a recently purchased RV. The refurbished RV will enable the medical street outreach team to extend their reach, bringing essential medical services directly to those in need.

Our funds greatly enrich our programs and operations, strengthen our ministry locally and internationally, and ensure future resources for excelling in ministry not just to the next generation, but to all of the ones who follow. Our past donors had wonderful intentions, and Second Presbyterian honors their memory by continuing to fund the programs that they intended when they so graciously gave these gifts.

Benevolences, Mission and Outreach

- Mountain Avenue Fund provides annual support for local ministries dealing with homelessness, poverty, hunger, and at-risk children.
- **Lil Brown Benevolent Fund** (within Second Fund) respond to needs connected with mental health.
- **Help Fund** for meeting immediate needs, at the pastors' discretion.
- Gene and Treva Richter Fund (charter not yet written)

Christian Education
