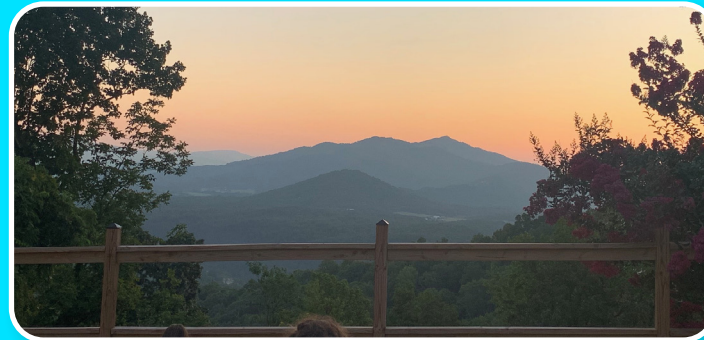

Shallowford Presbyterian Church in Atlanta, GA



Anna George Traynham was called to be Shallowford's sixth senior pastor in the fall of 2019. She is originally from the small town of Fountain Inn, South Carolina and studied music and religion at Presbyterian College in Clinton, SC. After graduation, Anna moved to Richmond to attend Union Presbyterian Seminary, where she worked for Second Presbyterian Church in downtown Richmond and obtained a graduate certificate in counseling from Virginia Commonwealth University. In 2014, Anna was called to serve Central Presbyterian Church in Atlanta, first as a resident pastor and then as an associate pastor. During her time at Central, Anna also completed her Master's in Business Administration from The Citadel Graduate College in Charleston. Anna is passionate about helping the church be a place where all people are invited into transformational community, with a particular eye for people on the margins. Anna, her husband Blake, and their daughter, Mary Evelyn, love calling Shallowford home.

RETREAT THEME

I Love to Tell the Story

HOUSING FOR THE RETREAT

Participants will be placed in either the Cedar Crest Hotel or the Voight Conference Center (rooms will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis). Both facilities have hotel-style accommodations with private baths, linen service, wireless internet, and handicap accessibility. A brief description of each location is listed below:

CEDAR CREST HOTEL

Extensively remodeled in 2006, Cedar Crest Hotel features gorgeous mountain views and top-class quality. Cedar Crest also features:

- 38 hotel-style rooms with personal bathrooms.
- A large lobby area for fellowship with leather sofas.
- Vending area with free coffee, microwave and ice machine.
- Rocking chairs just outside the lobby area overlooking Fleming Mountain.



VOIGHT CONFERENCE CENTER

The Voight Conference Center rooms are high quality and conveniently located near the dining hall and other facilities. VCC also features:

- 16 well-appointed guest rooms (two of which are ADA designed).
- A large lobby area with a stone fireplace and baby grand piano.
- Vending area with free coffee and water, along with coffee makers in each room.
- Balconies overlooking the campus.
