ADVENT SERMON SERIES & SERVICES

The Gospels speak of days of cultural tension in Palestine. Rome was an occupying force, King Herod could be ruthless in his rule, illnesses like leprosy (Hansen's disease) were common and poverty was the norm. Yet, early in the Gospels, songs keep breaking out. I am talking of a mother's cousin, or an old priest, or even angels. Joy erupts over the news that a particular child is born into the world.

This is my pastor's note, but I want to quote Elizabeth Link's beautiful words about our upcoming Advent Sermon Series: "This Advent season, Second Presbyterian chooses light and love and joy even in the midst of a weary world. 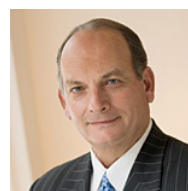
It was a highly musical event. The speaker was a jazz musician turned pastor, Chris Vogado, and our chief musician was Carter Brothers. We sang a lot, and the theme for the weekend was the history of rock music and how it relates to the life of the church. It was educational, thought-provoking and wonderful.

However, that is not why I am writing this note. I want to tell you about a paradigm shift I had at the retreat. When I saw what the topic was, I knew it was going to be interesting, but I wondered how the older men who attended the retreat might feel. Then came my moment. Ken Sizemore is not old, but he was one of the older men attending the retreat. He serves on our session and looks every bit the part of the respectable financial manager that he

is. Chris mentioned Woodstock, and Ken decided to show me a picture of what he looked like back then. You can see that "Before" picture below as well as an "After" picture that was taken recently.

It dawned on me. Everyone in that room grew up with Rock and Roll. You have to be well past retirement age to have any adult years that were not also Rock and Roll years. The Beatles appeared on The Ed Sullivan Show 14 years before Adam Levine was born, 15 years before Pink was born, 25 years before Taylor Swift was born, and 30 years before Justin Bieber was born.

That is what Chris was trying to realize. Some think of Rock and Roll as the music of rebellion, but the music's history reflects what happens to people, cultures and churches. There is a constant tension and ebb and flow between convergence and divergence. Perhaps what music seeks is what we all hope to achieve; not the uniformity of a single melody where everyone sings the same notes in the same key, but the blending of different voices singing different parts, creating a beautiful harmony.

THE LONGEST NIGHT

December 18, 2024 | 6:00 p.m. | Sanctuary

For those who have experienced loss, the holidays can be a particularly painful time, stirring up grief in acute ways. Many churches have adopted the practice of hosting a Longest Night service on or around the winter solstice, honoring those grappling with loss and grief. On Wednesday, Dec 18, at 6:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary we will hold a Longest Night service of prayer, song, and meditation. Our hope is that this worship service will create a safe and sacred space for those who are struggling to feel the joy and light of this Advent and Christmas season due to loss of any kind. We do not intend for this service to be a service of healing, for what we lose cannot always be replaced. Instead, we hope this service will acknowledge the hole that grief leaves in one's heart while simultaneously remembering that we worship a God who is with us, even in the darkest of times.

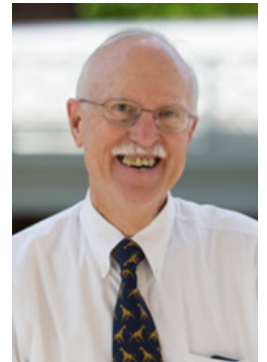
