# PASTOR'S NOTES - DR. GEORGE C. ANDERSON

I am often asked what it is like to serve the same church for 27 years. When fellow ordained clergy talk with me about this, one of their most frequent questions is: How do you stay fresh in your teaching and preaching?

I have a number of responses, and serving a vital church that keeps me engaged is an important one. But another major reason is Second Presbyterian's strong commitment to my ongoing growth and learning. You've provided resources for continuing education—funding for books, two weeks each year for study, and even special funds for extraordinary educational opportunities and sabbaticals.

Over the years, I've had the privilege of taking three sabbatical studies: on Scottish Spirituality, the Nurture of Newly Ordained Ministers, and the intersection of Architecture and Faith. Each one renewed my spirit and deepened my theological understanding. You gave me the time and space to go—but in doing so, you helped me stay.

If you asked Rev. Elizabeth Link what has helped her remain fresh in her ministry over the past 14 years, I believe she'd say much the same. Our congregation's investment in her continuing education has been a vital support.



# SUMMER READING FOLLOWING JESUS IN A WARMING WORLD

Jesus' first request of his disciples was "Follow me." Little did they know that, "This call to follow was the beginning of a journey of transformation and discipleship, where they would learn from his teachings, witness his miracles, and ultimately become the foundational leaders of the early Christian church."

What about the church today? If you want your eyes opened to what it means to be a follower of Jesus today, you will enjoy reading Kyle Meyaard-Schaap's book *Following Jesus in a Warming World:* A *Christian Call to Climate Action* published in 2023 by InterVarsity Press. It challenges readers to see their faith in a new light and take action based on that understanding. It emphasizes that caring for creation should be a joyful expression of faith, not a burden.



One reviewer writes, "Described as 'a field guide for Christian climate action—one grounded not in a sense of guilt or drudgery, but in the joy of caring for creation,' this book calls Christians to a deeper understanding of discipleship and witness. Following Jesus in a Warming World: A Christian Call to Climate Action invites readers to reconsider and expand our understanding of evangelism and what it truly means to spread the Good News in light of the climate crisis. For many of us, especially young people who yearn to feel seen and understood in their faithful advocacy, this book bears witness to the urgency of the climate crisis and affirms the Christian call to climate action."

In November 2021, an Earth Care Summit hosted by Presbytery of the Peaks Earth Care Team, a subcommittee of the Justice and Mercy Commission, recorded the following statement, "As a faith community, we can be a model to the larger community and a witness to the faith we profess by taking visible concrete actions that express what we believe about creation and our role in caring for it."

Grounded in Jesus' unconditional and reconciling love, this book speaks truth to power about God's Creation and humankind's responsibility in caring for it. It is a clarion call to live out one's faith in a meaningful and transformative way that actively addresses the defining moral challenge of our time.

Join Lisa Goad, Program Coordinator, and Noelle Edwards, Outreach Coordinator, as they help us try to "walk in the shoes" of some of the women in their program. Gain a better understanding of the hurdles some of our neighbors face, and experience a new perspective in the gap House of Bread tries to help fill. House of Bread is a program for under-resourced women looking to make a fresh start. Over the course of six-weeks, women learn job and personal skills through hands-on training, coupled with mentors and volunteers from the Roanoke community.



In addition to learning basic kitchen skills, women graduate from the program with ServSafe food handler and/or manager training, develop customer service experience, and partner one-on-one with mentors who work with them to set and meet goals.




