

BULLETIN NOTES

¹ *Come, Holy Spirit, Heavenly Dove* is a prayerful hymn written by Isaac Watts in the early 18th century. While many of Watts' hymns express joyful praise, this one is marked by a tone of spiritual longing. It invites the Holy Spirit to awaken dry hearts, rekindle love for God, and stir a deeper faith within us. As we sing, we join in a centuries-old plea: that God's Spirit would move among us, reviving hope, deepening love, and renewing our patience in the waiting.

²The Outreach Offering for June will benefit *Pack-a-Snack Weekend Snacks* for Hungry Children. 150 children benefited from the Pack a Snack programs at Highland Park and Morningside Elementary Schools during this past school year. Second Presbyterian and its partner churches of the Old Southwest Congregations in Action provided Highland Park with about 55 bags every week of the school year. Along with Greene Memorial UMC, Second Pres packed 90 bags for Morningside School every week. The cost of this ministry continues to rise and it takes \$1,000 a month to send home six items to tide the children over the weekend. Your generosity will ensure this most needed food program continues in 2025-26.

The Outreach Offering for the month of May supported *House of Bread*. As of Thursday, May 22, \$3,660 was collected.
