# PASTOR'S NOTES - DR. GEORGE C. ANDERSON

#### **EVENING VBS: NAVIGATING THE WILDERNESS**

On June 8–11, Dr. Ed McLeod will return to lead the adult program for Evening Bible School for the third—and possibly final—time. Many of you have come to know Ed through his previous visits, including two memorable Bible School sessions and his longtime leadership in the Trent Symposium for Newly Ordained Ministers, which he has helped guide since 2008. He has also preached in our pulpit on many occasions, each time bringing wisdom, warmth, and depth.

We have been extraordinarily fortunate to welcome Ed so often. A gifted scholar and communicator, he is a sought-after preacher and teacher across the church. Yet, despite the demands of travel and time away from his own church and family, Ed has consistently accepted our invitations with grace. He has a deep affection for this congregation and feels at home among us.

This year, he will help us explore the theme of *being faithful in the wilderness*. In Scripture, the wilderness is not just a place of desolation, but a sacred space of transformation. It's where Moses meets God in the burning bush; where Israel is formed as a covenant people; where Elijah hears the still, small voice; and where Jesus is both tested and prepared for ministry. Theologically, the wilderness strips away our illusions of control, revealing our

#### Original Artwork featuring Second Presbyterian Stained Glass Window and Alexa House

I am a local resident of Franklin County, having retired as a licensed art teacher for grades K-12 in Fairfax County Public Schools, Northern VA. My husband and I relocated to the Smith Mountain Lake area in March of 2021. Coincidentally, Roanoke had just begun a program coinciding with the height of Covid to bring artists together via ZOOM meetings. Thus began my personal journey of procuring grant support via the National Foundation for the Arts, Year of the Artist, aka YODA, Roanoke. In working with the city of Roanoke, I obtained an ART Matters grant wherein a variety of social concerns were to be examined. My grant is multi-faceted as I utilize my skills as a visual artist, a writer, and harmonica player in bringing the topics of housing insecurity and homelessness to the public forefront. The name of my grant is Housing Insecurity Explored. Under this umbrella, many fine Roanoke folks met with me for discussions/interviews. This particular grant is reflective of the following areas: Police/EMS/Religious/Fire Fighters of the City of Roanoke relative to the topic of housing insecurity.

I was referred to Second Presbyterian Church, specifically Dr. George Anderson, as a contact for the Alexa House. Thus began my meeting with your excellent pastor. He proved to be too humble to agree to let me create his portrait (he wanted to give credit to many others). After giving me a tour of your magnificent church, I came to the conclusion weeks later to replicate, in watercolor, one of the beautiful stained glass window panes. (Subtopic/Religious)

Little did I know how challenging this would be! I like to think the stained glass piece is symbolic of the common bond and concentric concern your church community and other denominations have for the homeless. This symbolism as depicted in the stained glass, in my view, is revealed in its overlapping of the circles, the branches of greenery, its little crosses, and its magnificent colors. We can find the beauty of God's love as it is symbolized in the stained glass window as multiple community faiths that have come together, overlapping (as in the circles) living faith (as seen in the crosses) and bringing new life (as seen in the green branch sprouts). I thought the stained glass window was a perfect subject matter to be representative of the answered call of faith regardless of denomination.

Alexa House is an incredible embodiment of the love of God. (Subtopic/Religious) You at Second Presbyterian, as well as other denominations/faiths, have heard the call of God and acted upon His Calling. The four families that are able to call this beautiful house their temporary transitional home are indeed fortunate to spend time in this soothingly attractive environment. Throughout Dr. Anderson's tour of the interior of the home, I was inspired by Alexa's photography and the replicated quotes from her journals displayed tastefully on the walls. They served to convey the sensitive and artistic spirit of Alexa herself, for whom the home was named. It is tragic indeed that Alexa sustained an early death at the hands of a perpetrator, on her college campus. Thanks to Alexa's family, the efforts of Second Presbyterian Church of Roanoke, and others too many to mention, the Alexa House came to be. The Cannon family wished to memorialize their daughter, Alexa, via this renovated home and bring good out of a horrible event. Two other families should be referenced for their contributions. One of these Roanoke families is that of Rita Magnus, who was killed in the Holocaust as a child. Her two surviving sisters have contributed greatly and are behind the future Rita Magnus Memorial Playground to be constructed behind Alexa House. Finally, Dan Yardley's family has greatly contributed to the construction of Alexa House. Dan was killed abruptly during Thanksgiving of 2017 in an unfortunate car accident. Additional fundraising and donations helped to offset the monetary needs required to bring the home up to new fire code standards. I specifically chose the Alexa House to be the subject matter of one of my 6 grant paintings as it is such a lovely example of how so many faiths have worked together in volunteer efforts to address the subject of Housing Insecurity in Roanoke. (Subtopic/Religious)

Currently, the works are on display at Piedmont Art Museum in Martinsville May 30th–July 25th (<u>www.piedmontarts.</u> org). Plans are underway for a more formal "art opening" of my work with Art on First later in the year, located in Roanoke, date to be announced. You can expect to see the grant work as well the written and musical components I have created, revealing further insight into my subject matter of choice. 
