

²THE OUTREACH OFFERING for June will benefit Pack-a-Snack Weekend Snacks for Hungry Children. 150 children benefited from the Pack a Snack programs at Highland Park and Morningside Elementary Schools during this past school year. Second Presbyterian and its partner churches of the Old Southwest Congregations in Action provided Highland Park with about 55 bags every week of the school year. Along with Greene Memorial UMC, Second Pres packed 90 bags for Morningside School every week.
