PASTOR'S NOTES - DR. GEORGE C. ANDERSON

LOOKING AHEAD: HONORING LEGACIES AND INVESTING IN THE CHURCH'S FUTURE

It may be summer now, but I'm already looking ahead to the upcoming program year at Second Presbyterian Church—and to some of the exciting opportunities on the horizon. I want to share with you two initiatives that reflect both our congregation's generosity and its deep commitment to nurturing the future leadership of the church.

First, I am honored to tell you about an event that will mark the inaugural initiative supported by a fund that bears Millie's and my name. The **George and Millie Anderson Cornerstone Fund for Pastoral Excellence** was established by George Cartledge III—an act of generosity that deeply humbles us and gives me a responsibility I already take seriously: to advance the cause of excellence in pastoral ministry in this congregation and in the larger church.

Together with Elizabeth Link and Andrew Whaley, we have planned a gathering to fulfill that mission. On November 10 and 11, we will host the first *Cornerstone Colloquy*, which coincides with the 2025 Edmunds Lectures featuring Dr. Andrew Root. While Dr. Root will lecture in the evenings, during the day he will engage with 18 invited Presbyterian ministers from across the country. Five presenters will share insights from their ministry contexts

in light of Dr. Root's influential work on ministry in a secular age. After each presentation, Dr. Root will first offer a response, followed by guided discussion among the gathered pastors.

Dr. Root's writing has sparked enthusiasm among pastors seeking faithful and thoughtful ways to lead in a rapidly changing world. This event will deepen understanding of his work and foster a network of support among ministers who are doing important work across the country. It is a fitting example of how our congregation continues to invest in the future of the church.

I also want to lift up another new fund, born from a legacy of love and commitment. In coordination with the family of Frank and Martha Clay Martin, and through a generous bequest from Martha Clay's estate, the session has established the **Frank and Martha Clay Martin Fund for Youth**. Part of the bequest has already funded a much-needed van for youth trips, and this fund will continue to support youth and young adult ministries in the years to come.

This is a beautiful and fitting tribute to a family that has long been devoted to the spiritual growth of young people. Martha Clay was a founding leader of the former Wednesday evening *Youth Club* program, which once drew over 150 youth to our church each week for study, music, dinner, and prayer.

The Rev. Ben Brannan will take the lead in ensuring that the intent of this fund is honored well. We can all look forward to the quality programs and meaningful opportunities that this new resource will make possible beginning in 2026.

These two new funds reflect the ongoing generosity and vision of this congregation—and they serve as reminders that our witness to Christ does not end with what we do today. Through legacy gifts and forward-looking ministry, we continue to invest in what God is doing next.

THE LIGHT WE SHINE

The Light We Shine is the theme chosen by the Stewardship Committee for 2025. It reminds us that the light shining through our witness and work is not our own, but the light of Jesus Christ. Second Presbyterian Church does not exist to proclaim its own good news, but the good news of God's grace made known in him.

We are grateful for the strong ministries of worship and education, fellowship and care, and meaningful outreach to our community. But our deepest joy comes from being—together—a living witness to the trans-*Shine* is not about spotlighting ourselves. It is about reflecting the light of Christ into a world in need.



In the months ahead, we look forward to sharing more stories and reflections on how this theme radiates through our life together. May the light we shine burn ever brighter as our faith deepens, our commitment strengthens, and as we extend Christ's light to others.

FROM OUR SUMMER PASTORAL INTERN

A Reflection by Ramsay Reid

It is likely that I will be able to recall my first day here at Second Presbyterian for many years to come. I will always remember how nervous I was, not just because of my worries over making a good impression on everyone, but because that day happened to be the day that Dr. Jim Rice's memorial service was held. Now, if there is anything I have learned during my time here, it is to always be prepared for the unexpected, and my first day proved no different. The thing is: my ability to think on my feet has never been one of my strengths. Even in college, an environment where loads of unexpected things happen all the time, I have always remained very bookish—very contemplative—so realizing that wading into the unknown was part of my job description was intimidating.

Even so, once I had powered through my initial jitters, I realized just how excited I was to be here, and to be a part of this incredible community. This excitement only continued to grow as I began to settle into a working rhythm. Early on, I can remember waking up and going through the list of the new experiences I would have, the new people I would meet, and the new things I would learn. I still do that even now to some extent, over a month into my time here. I have undergone so much personal growth this summer, and I know that I will continue to be shaped by this incredible place, long after I have left.

This summer has also been instrumental in growing my understanding of my call to the ministry. I have been able to get involved in so many of the day-to-days of a pastor, and I truly cannot overstate how much I have relished these chances. From just delivering flowers to actually serving in worship, my duties have given me quite the peek into what the future holds for me as I make my way along the path to my own pastorate some day. All of these experiences have been hugely impactful for me, but far and away the one that has meant the most to me is something that is perhaps not that obvious at first. It is customary after worship for the pastor (or pastors) to shake hands with everyone as they leave. For most people, this part of Sunday morning probably plays a minor role, but I personally feel that it is one of the most important rituals that a pastor performs.

The first Sunday I was here, I had the privilege of doing this alongside George in Kirk Hall. This experience served as my introduction to many of the members of this church and is one that I will always treasure. As people came to introduce themselves and speak with me, I was overcome with their genuine excitement and joy over my being here. Speaking to so many people in such a short time frame would wear me out usually, but this time was altogether different. As each person came up to me, I became increasingly overwhelmed by my own excitement about meeting them and being here for the summer. I recall grinning uncontrollably as I shook hands with everyone. I realize now that what I was feeling was something very holy indeed. This ritual is where, as a pastor, you are given a glimpse into the body of Christ itself. You hear from the whole congregation, about their lives, joys, struggles, and all. In my case, through the warmth of the people I met, I was able to see that I was being welcomed with open arms by Christ and by his church. And it is when I saw this that I experienced such a profound feeling of love, such that I could not contain myself and my joy.

I want to thank you all for an already incredible summer, and I hope that I have lived up to everything you hoped for. I know that I still have so many new things ahead of me, and I am here for it. One thing that I cannot wait to experience is my capstone sermon on the 17th, my last day here. I know that it will be an excellent send-off for this summer, and I hope to see you there!
