## PASTOR'S NOTES - DR. GEORGE C. ANDERSON

Through Scripture, reflection, and shared conversation, we’ll consider how God calls us to build one another up so that, together, we may more faithfully reflect Christ to the world.

### PHISHING SCAM AWARENESS

Be aware of phishing. The latest scam variant that churches across the country are experiencing is an email asking for a copy of the church directory. Often, these come from @gmail.com addresses deceptively created with a real person's name, but are dummy accounts seeking info for scamming purposes. These scams may impersonate pastors, Presbyterian administrators, staff persons, etc., seeking gift card donations for a cause or a request to receive a church directory.

You will never receive an email from a minister or staff of Second Presbyterian Church asking for financial assistance to address needs, such as the purchase of gift cards. We recommend the communication of banking info either in person (safest option) or over the phone with Nathan Anderson, Church Administrator (540-343-3659) on a call initiated by you.

If you ever receive an email that claims to be from a pastor or staff that seems odd, is from an unrecognized email address, or that raises a red flag for any reason, please use caution. Do NOT click "reply". Do NOT click any links contained in the email. Verify, using a method other than email, if a request for information is legitimate. NEVER send money or personal information (names, addresses, social security numbers, banking info, etc.) without confirmation. Scams may be reported to the FTC at [ReportFraud.ftc.gov](http://ReportFraud.ftc.gov).
